The very first badge *every* Scout must earn when starting out is the Bobcat badge. It introduces important ideas that every Scout should know.

1. Learn and say the SCOUT OATH with help if needed.

2. Learn and say the SCOUT LAW with help if needed.

A Scout is: Trustworthy, Loyal, Helpful, Friendly, Courteous, Kind, Obedient, Cheerful, Thrifty Brave, Clean, and Reverent.

3. Show the CUB SCOUT SIGN. Tell what it means.
